SATAY & KUMARA SALAD

Serves 4

Ingredients

500g Sweet potato/kumara, peeled and cut into 2cm thick slices

1 large onion, sliced into 1/2 cm thick rings

2 tablespoons butter

1 tablespoon fruit chutney

3 tablespoons satay marinade or teriyaki sauce

Oil or oil spray

Optional

Pine Nuts

■ Baby Spinach Leaves

Method

- I. Place sweet potato/kumara in oiled frypan. Oil top of sweet potato/kumaraslices.
- 2. Cook for 30 minutes or until cooked as desired, turning once. Allow to cool.
- 3. Cook onion gently in the butter until golden and transparent. Set aside.
- 4. Cut kumara into bite-sized pieces and place in a heatproof serving bowl.
- 5. Add chutney, satay sauce and onion, gently tossing to mix ingredients and combine flavours.
- 6. Serve warm.
