SECONDARY EXCURSION

We knew it was going to be a good day when we got to school at 5.30am Tuesday morning but then it started to rain. We travelled all day to The Tops. When we arrived we unpacked the bus in the rain. We then proceeded to have lunch and then be split in two groups, seahorse and starfish.

The first activities we were to participate in were the leap of faith and survivor. The leap of faith involved climbing and standing on top of a 10 metre telegraph like pole and then proceeding to jump towards a ring in mid air.

The survivor challenge involved teamwork skills which were shown through activities such as moving planks to cross a 'river', swinging across a 'canyon' and climbing a net to get the 'fruit'.

We then split up for rooms and we had showers as we were soaked all the way through.

After tea, we played speed stacks, which involved stacking and unstacking special cups. After the cup relays we built a mega tower. On Wednesday it was still raining. On the giant swing you were on a harness and a pulley system. You were swinging from about

ten metres. Archery was a team competition to see who could get the highest score.

Pedal karts were across a creek and they were on a racing track. They were very fun and used a lot of concentration. The night activity was trivia. Thursday there was a bit of sun. We travelled to Jamberoo Water Park, where we spent the day having fun on water rides. We travelled the scenic route back to the Tops so that we could see the beach. The night activity was watching a movie, so we watched Wild Hogs. On Friday we travelled to Penrith. We played laser skirmish and went shopping. Then we travelled home. It was a fantastic time although it was wet.
