IMPORTANT ROAD SAFETY REMINDER FOR PARENTS & CARERS THESE HOLIDAYS


The best way to keep your child safe on or near the road is to hold their hand.

Principal's Message

Chaplain's Chat

This is a funny time of year. We're all looking forward to the holidays, yet at the same time we are reflecting on the year that has been. 2014 was a very different year to 2013 and I suspect it will be different again in 2015.

I am trying to look ahead and plan what I need to do in preparation for 2015. Is there training I need to do – or a refresher course to help with presenting "Rock and Water" or "Resilience Doughnut" programs. I'm not a teacher so it helps to refresh my understanding of what is to be done and how I do it so the students benefit. I know already I will be refreshing my "Safe Ministry with Children" certificate which in my case includes working with adults to current (new) standards. 
Self-care seems to be a maze of contradictions, but one thing it is not is selfish.
