Principal's Message

Hello everybody. The final Year 10 Work Experience takes place this week with all students placed in businesses close to home. This program is very good for students as they gain a greater understanding of the pressures and expectations of the work place. It also allows local employers to interact with our students and gain an understanding of the quality, attitude and work ethic of these fine young people. Many a good vocation has been earned through work experience.

Headspace spoke to Year 8 today about the pressures of school and the dangers and impacts of bullying. Nick and Jess provided a great workshop which related well to our students because of the personal interest stories which they or their colleagues have experienced or witnessed.

The Yr 6 into 7 transition will take place tomorrow, with year 6 students experiencing the rigours of High School lessons and following a timetable, including the expectations of the teachers and the pressures of moving between classrooms and arriving on time. We have found that the anxiety and stress students may have on entering high school are instantly alleviated by this experience. Parents of these students are also supported through the Information Evening that concludes the day. Parents' anxieties are put to rest very quickly through this information evening which usually concludes with a tour of the secondary facilities.

Years 8, 9 and 11 will have a unique talk by some practicing engineers through a program called "Engineers without Borders". Engineering is a profession which deals with planning, designing and solving problems in the work place.

Yr 5/6 will receive a talk on Sex Education this week. With students needing key information about serious issues, relating to body changes through maturation, forming relationships and possible sexual activity in the future, at a younger age, we hope that they will be well informed when difficult decisions need to be made. These talks are very informative and provide current information on a number of very relevant issues impacting on the young people of today. Difficult questions can be answered in a professional way in a controlled environment.

Yr 11 Interviews will take place on Wednesday between students, Mrs Fergusson (Careers Teacher) and myself. These are designed to assist students to begin focussing on goals and strategies which will assist them to maximise their marks and their choices for and beyond the HSC.

SENA testing is being conducted in the Infants School to assess the numeracy development of students throughout this year. It helps teachers to find areas in which students have excelled and areas which still need development. The testing is augmented by the Count Me In Too Numeracy program which teaches students a number of successful strategies to solve numerical problems. This process is supporting students to achieve excellent results in Year 3 NAPLAN and beyond.

WE have another student-teacher joining us for his Practicum over the next three weeks. His name is Benjamin Bruce, and he is working with Mr Kline's class. I hope everyone will make Benjamin feel welcome, and support him, so that his experience is worthwhile and productive.

Fifteen SRC students are scheduled to attend the National Young Leaders Conference in Sydney this week. This is a fantastic program which allows our students to not only meet like-minded students from other schools, from across the state, but also gain well presented information about leadership, achievement, the importance of goal setting, utilising the experience of mentors and working with others, from a range of noted Australians including Generals, CEO's, Celebrities and Sports Stars. Governor General, Sir Peter Cosgrove, round the World sailor, Jessica Watson and Premier, Mike Baird are noted former speakers at this event.

Reports are now being reviewed by Executive Teachers and are on track to be delivered to students by the scheduled date.

Our end of Year Scripture Assembly will take place this Friday and is always a happy, fun-related event revealing our students' connection with the Christian ethos and the values shown to us by Jesus. Our Scripture teachers always work hard with the students to provide a very entertaining assembly.

Mark Young our Director, once again complimented us for being an exemplary school. Well done students and staff. Enjoy your week!



Safer Driver Course

Skillset Dubbo is running the RMS accredited Safer Driver Course for Learner Drivers. The next course in Dubbo will be on Saturday 5th December between 9am and 12noon.

The Safer Driver Course is a combined theoretical and practical course for learner drivers under 25 years-old who have completed 50 log book driving hours.

The Safer Driver Course involves two modules:

Module 1: A three – hour facilitated group discussion on how to manage risks on the road.

Module 2: A two-hour in-vehicle coaching session with a coach and another learner to develop low risk driving strategies.

Benefits of attending a Safer Drivers Course

The course aims to provide learner drivers with driving strategies such as speed management, gap selection, hazard awareness and safe following distances so they are more prepared when they drive unsupervised on their provisional licences.

The course also aims to help identify situations that will put them at greater risk of a crash and consider strategies that will help avoid them.

Gaining 20 hours of Log Book Credit

After completing the Course, a learner will receive 20 hours of credit in their log book, meaning they only need to complete 100 hours of supervised driving outside the Course.

The Course costs \$140. Learners who attend the Safer Driver Course must bring their learner licence and learner driver log book. There is a maximum of 12 participants per course.

Chaplain's Chat

How do you and your family cope with loss and grief? We each seem to have our own unique way of doing this. But, I am wondering what helps you to cope? There are many things we grieve about in our lives, and not just the death of a loved one. We also grieve when we lose our health, when we move (especially if we were happy previously), when our circumstances change (loss of job, health or mobility). I am aware of a friend who is dealing with loss of licence, which in turn has led to loss of job.

Our children often have loss imposed through our actions as parents. We move – often work related – and they have to adapt to new school: culture, friends and people; and mourn the loss of their old system. How do we support them?

We have several means available:

Let them talk about it, what is making them happy and sad at present;

Ask what they would like to be doing. No, we can't undo that but how can we work through this together?

Be supportive – let their class/year teacher know there is an issue so it can be monitored at school, and communication established to support your child. Children often 'act out' to draw attention to their emotional pain.

Our young people haven't always got the words at their disposal to tell us that a feeling is 'not right' in their world – especially if it is. "I know I **should** be happy, but I feel so alone" is often accompanied by a sense of guilt because mum/dad/others are so happy at this change.

Children grieve when illness attacks their family. Not their own illness, but a parent or sick sibling upsets the balance and ushers in more change. This is often complicated by feeling guilty about their reaction.


Other signs may be a change in their attitude to school, where once they couldn't get there quick enough, now they long to stay away; "It's not a happy place any more since my friend left" may indicate the issue.

Love your child. Accept what is going on as their reality. If you are really concerned about changed behaviour or anxiety, talk with the doctor and the class teacher.

Our children are our future. Parenting didn't come with a handbook – well, not in my experience – but I sometimes felt and still feel as if they had access to one in the womb which adults and parents are expected to know intuitively. We aren't perfect people, we are however people who strive to do our best for our children.
