

Stock movement Stock handling



My Future Finder (MFF)

Years 9, 10 and 11 will be taking part in My Future Finder Student

Engagement Workshops on Friday 2nd December. The workshops will focus on assisting

students to interpret their My Future Finder report and understand their own personality 'style', giving an insight into a range of relevant career and study pathways open to them.

The workshops are approximately 1 period in duration and Year 9 students will be required to complete their MFF profile before the workshop. This will be done during roll call. Year 10 and 11 students have already completed this activity and used the MFF for both mock and community interviews. Past Year 12 students have used the information gathered to assist them in completing scholarship and job applications. Having students complete the MFF allows UNE to have ongoing contact with them about Open Day, Early Entry, scholarships, accommodation application processes as well as assisting with course information and providing campus tours as required. The results are also reported to you via email and can be used to provide student direction in career lessons and student/parent discussions relating to subject selection, career and study choices etc.


