



As the theme song, "I've Been Everywhere" played, 21 students from Years 3 to 11 set out on this year's production, *The Excursion*. Hill, students saw 'some hot babes' who turned out to be the cast from *Priscilla*, *Queen of the Desert*. Our homesick travellers contemplated their journey as they watched Year 5/6's puppetry to "True Colors" at the Great Barrier Reef. I'm sure you will learn a great deal about yourselves and your future possibilities on attending these excellent courses.

For those of you who saw our School Production, "The Excursion", I'm sure you had a wonderful experience. Everyone I have spoken to since the performance has said how enjoyable an evening they had and what talented students we have at Dunedoo Central School. A number of students did stand out and that is why the school production is so important. Many of our other students have enjoyed the opportunity of performing and will never forget it. I'd like once again to thank our exceptional production team of Mr Constant, Mrs Elizabeth Abbott and Mrs Scifleet for driving the event, Mrs Douglass and her extremely talented sewing ladies for creating those remarkable costumes and our very supportive and talented staff for performing their roles to perfection, in order to provide such a quality infused opportunity for our very eager students. Our next performance will be in two years time and I'm sure a number of students will be inspired to aspire for key performance roles in that event. Thank you again to all of our parents and community members who supported our school by joining us for the evening.

School Reports have been presented to all students to take home and discuss their progress with mums and dads. The reports are once again of a high quality and provide a good insight into your child's performance, progress and potential. I'd like to take this opportunity to once again thank staff for the many hours, spent inside and outside school time, preparing such in-depth and relevant reports.

Our Annual Award Night will take place tomorrow evening. This is an opportunity for the school to acknowledge exceptional performances by students who attend our school. All awards are determined either by a strict process involving

collation of marks or through a vote from the whole staff, after extensive consultation. I hope as many parents and community members can join us as possible, it is always a great night.

Parents are reminded that if you have concerns about another child who attends Dunedoo Central School, in relation to your own child, then you need to see a teacher or myself about your concerns. Our policy is to make all children feel safe while attending this school. It is not appropriate to address your concerns with the child on school grounds due to Child Protection legislation and the Safe Schools policy. If this happens I will contact the parent in question, discuss the issue and provide a warning. The extreme measure that can be applied in circumstances involving parents overstepping the mark, is for the School Principal to invoke the Inclosed Land Act, which prohibits a parent or persons from entering school grounds for a set period of time, resulting in a chargeable offence if not adhered to.

With the excessive rain through the winter and the excessive growth of crops and grasses resulting from this, Dunedoo has now been placed in the Bush Fire zone. As a result of this, we are currently developing a School Bush Fire Policy and Action Plan in case of an extreme bush fire emergency, with the extreme measure being to evacuate the whole town to a neighbouring town, not impacted by the bush fire.

This Thursday, 8th December, the P&C have organised their final meeting to be conducted at the Dunedoo Hotel , for the special end of year dinner. The dinner is in acknowledgement of all those parents who have supported the P&C throughout the year.

The special Transition Disco will also take place on Thursday evening. This Disco is in honour of our preschool students who will be transitioning into Kindergarten next year and our Year 6 student who will be transitioning into High School.

The Teachers' Federation will be conducting a Consultation Meeting with all members on Thursday Morning from 8.30am until 9.45am. Many of our teachers have indicated that they will be attending. During this time there will be suitable supervision provided by the remaining staff. Normal lessons will take place from 10.00am onwards. Please see accompanying information provided in this Newsletter.

Information for parents, guardians and students

Our school has partnered with Transport for NSW to use the new online process for you to submit school travel applications.

This means we will be able to process your applications online, making it easier and faster for parents, guardians and students to apply for school travel.

Applications for school travel in 2017 are now open, including for travel to Mascot and Green Square station and for private ferries. Parents, guardians and students are encouraged to apply as soon as they are able via:

Applications for 2017 school travel are now open via www.transportnsw.info/school-students

A new application is required when:

- applying for a School Opal card or travel pass for the first time,
- · enrolling in Kindergarten, or
- requesting an additional entitlement as a result of a shared parental responsibility situation.

You will need to do an update application if the student has a current school travel pass and:

- is progressing from Year 2 to Year 3,
- is progressing from Year 6 to Year 7, or
- · changes address, or
- · changes school or campus.

Already have a School Opal card or travel pass?

- When you've updated, and you are eligible for free school travel next year, Transport for NSW will send you an email confirmation once your application has been processed. For travel in rural or regional NSW, we'll also inform your nominated transport operator(s).
- If you already have a School Opal card that does not need updating, or you've successfully re-applied, the Opal card will automatically be updated for travel next year. Do not throw it out as you'll be able to use it when the school year starts in 2017.
- If you currently have a printed travel pass provided by your transport operator, a new pass will be will be ready at the beginning of the new school year.
