Chaplain

Dunedoo Central School is seeking an outstanding and qualified individual in our community, who has a positive attitude towards our school, to perform the role of School Chaplain. The Chaplain will work 8 hours per week, in a mainly pastoral care role with an emphasis on counselling and supporting students and conducting small group programs which will help students to develop self-esteem, self-efficacy and resilience.

The General Requirements of the School Chaplain are as follows:

School Chaplains can be of any faith but must meet the following criteria:

Understand that participation by schools and students is voluntary;

Chaplains must:

- i. not proselytise;
- ii. respect, accept and be sensitive to other people's views, values and beliefs;
- iii. comply with NSW laws and policies in relation to child protection matters and to have undergone the NSW Working With Children Check as well as meeting the minimum qualifications as detailed below.

The Minimum Qualifications required for the position of School Chaplain are as follows:

- Either a Certificate IV in Youth Work or Pastoral care or an equivalent qualification (including competencies in mental health and making appropriate referrals)
- An individual who is recognised:
 - by the school community and the NSW Department of Education as having the skills and knowledge to deliver school chaplaincy to the school community;

through formal ordination, commissioning, recognised religious qualifications or endorsement by a recognised religious institution.

Position Information:

The position is paid, part-time (8 hours per week) and will commence on Monday, 5th February 2018 until Friday 19th December, 2018.

The Application Process:

Please outline in one A4 page your basis for selection as the School Chaplain at Dunedoo Central School, based on the criteria above. Copies of relevant qualifications will need to be provided as well as the names, roles and telephone numbers of two referees.
