
Dear Parents, Carers, Friends and Family,

SCHOOL STUDENT TRANSPORT

This is a reminder regarding the School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) and students progressing from:

- year 2 to 3; and
- year 6 to 7.

We have made some improvements to our system which now means that students who are progressing to year 3 and year 7 <u>do not need</u> to reapply if they meet the following three

• are continuing at the same school

conditions:

- are residing at the same address
- have not been sent an expiry notification from Transport for NSW.

The system has automatically validated a student's ongoing eligibility if they're at the same school and progressing to year 3 and year 7. Where a student met the new eligibility the system has updated their entitlement and card. If they didn't meet the new eligibility, they would have been sent an expiry notification.

If students need to update any information or reapply, they should go online to:

https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails.

Applications need to be submitted before **31 December 2017** to ensure students' entitlements are updated and their current card is not cancelled. If their application is submitted after **31 December 2017**, the system will automatically cancel their card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for an SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out during the 3rd week of January 2018.

Students residing in Rural and Regional (R&R) areas should receive their new travel pass at the commencement of the new school year in 2018. **Note**: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students should check with their operator for more information.

Careers @ DCS

Throughout Term 4 quite a few DCS students have taken part in Vocational opportunities offered to build or enhance work skills.

Community Interview - thank you Skillset: Our partnership with Skillset proves invaluable, year after year. As part of the Work Education program, students complete a "mock interview" very early in Term 2. To further develop interpersonal and employability skills, Year 10 then take part in "The Edge", a deportment day focussing on acceptable work place dress and behaviour, etiquette and table manners. This culminates in one-on-one interviews with a Skillset representative, where each student applies for a job-presenting a resume, cover letter and portfolio. This experience is invaluable, not only do the students experience the interview process first hand, but it allows Skillset to see the calliper of students available from DCS who may want to pursue further training under Skillset for an Apprenticeship or Traineeship. In 2018, there will be the further opportunity for students to sit an interview in front of a panel, as many interviews are now conducted on this way. **Work Experience:** Rory Obst has been assisting at Kakahma House over the past week. Thank you to all the MPS staff who have made this possible for Rory.

Zak Kelly has been very industrious in seeking a further week of work with LLS in Coonabarabran; this follows on from a previous week with Mal Leeson, Mudgee LLS. Well done Zak.

Bella Watton has been at Dubbo Hospital, following up her interest in Maternity. Very different from her first work experience as a spray painter, but that's what it's all about-pursuing your interests and exploring opportunities whilst you're still at school.
