Welcome to Week 10!

Last week, HSC results were released. A number of our students performed very well and have already received Early Entry Offers to the University of New England and the University of Newcastle. Tyson Craggs has also begun his apprenticeship in Dubbo, which he was able to take up after a successful VET work placement. Congratulations also to Zac Green of Year 10 who was successful in gaining a School Based Traineeship with the Warrumbungle Shire Council in the area of Horticulture. Zac will begin work-

ing one day per week next year, while completing his Preliminary HSC Studies.

Last week a number of our Year 10 & 11 Mathematics Students, Mrs Cathy Gallagher, Mrs Rachael Hogden and myself attended workshops presented by Eddie Woo. Eddie is an Australian Mathematician; he is currently Head Mathematics Teacher at Cherrybrook Technology High School and is known for his innovation and dynamic presentations in the classroom. Eddie started posting videos online for a sick student in 2012 and now shares his videos through Wootube, which boasts more than 100 000 subscribers. He was recognised at the Australian of the Year Awards and received the 2018 NSW Australia's Local

Hero Award. His presentation was very inspiring; Rachael and Cathy both had the opportunity to talk with Eddie during a staff workshop and Dinner.

This week parents will receive Year 6 and Year 10 VALID results. VALID is the Validation of Assessment for Learning and Individual Development for the Science Key Learning Areas. In Year 10, 9 students completed the assessment. 89% of this cohort achieved above the state av-



erage with 67% of the students achieving in the Top two bands. A great result for our Yr 10 students. In Year 6, 15 students completed the assessment. 33% of this cohort achieved above the state average with 33 % also achieving in the top 2 bands.

Last week our Adult & Year 11 Textiles Class had a display of what they have made this year. These people are very creative and should be so very proud of their efforts, ably assisted by Mrs Bronwenn Douglass. Nakita Martin, from Yr 12 should also be very proud of her Yr 12 Major Work and results in the HSC for Textiles and Design, achieving a Band 5 for her Overall result—this places her in the 2nd Highest Band for this subject. Well done Nakita!

Tomorrow we will be distributing to students their Lions Club Christmas Gift. This is an extremely generous donation from the wider Lions Club community with donations coming from a number of districts across our Country— from as far away as Perth. We hope that in some small way this will help parents with providing equipment/uniform for 2019 or a small gift for your child. Again the generosity of people is overwhelming.



the Frog and the 2016 Priscilla slide, and 4 library assistants (Karen, Ailsa, Alison and Mel), I have ac-


cepted a transfer to Dubbo College South Campus where I will be a full-time Teacher—Librarian.

Members of a team: We all enjoy and take pride in being part of a successful team. The community recognises and supports us in wearing our school uniform with pride.

But we are individuals: We can express our individuality in variety of ways, through our achievement and contribution in academic, sports, musical, social, technological and creative aspects of school life!


