ASPIRE Year 8 Beyond the Gate Excursion 2018

On the afternoon of Tuesday 20th November 2018 Jemma Nairne, Charna Williams, Ella Hickson and I caught the Rail Link bus from Dunedoo to Lithgow Railway Station. From there we caught the train to Sydney Central Station arriving at approximately 8.30 pm.

We were greeted by the ASPIRE team and, along with students and teachers from a wide variety of rural schools, we were taken to our motel in Sydney East (Darlinghurst) where we were fed Subway before receiving our itineraries and lights out.

On Wednesday we went to the Australian Film, Television and Radio School (AFTRS) where we learned about film-making. Each school was set the challenge of creating a 12 shot film, fully edited and incorporating a variety of camera angles, shots, background music and voiceovers.

We then travelled around the Sydney CBD on an open air double decker bus to soak up the sights. These included: The Opera House, Harbour Bridge, Observatory Hill, China Town and Coogee Beach where we had a late afternoon surf lifesaving lesson and swim. Aboriginal Cultural Liaison Officer Term 1 & 2 2019

Expressions of interest are invited from people interested in a career opportunity in the position of Aboriginal Cultural Liaison Officer. The role will encompass working within three central schools - Binnaway (1 day/week), Coolah (2 days/week) and Dunedoo (1 day/week), in Semester 1, 2019, with the possibility of an extension into Terms 3 or 4. The "home school" will be negotiated to be one of the three schools.

All three schools are located in small rural communities and desire to build stronger relationships with their Aboriginal communities. The core role is to work with school staff and to support Aboriginal students and their families to improve educational outcomes.
