a NSW Government youth mentoring program

WHAT IS YOUTH FRONTIERS? Youth Frontiers is a state-wide mentoring program for young people established by the NSW Government in 2015. Its objectives are to:

- Engage young people through quality mentoring with a focus on building confidence, self-esteem, and communication skills
- Enable young people to overcome barriers to community participation by developing team work, leadership and decision-making skills
- Recognise the positive development of young people and the contributions that they make in their local communities
- Build the capacity of mentors to provide quality mentoring to young people and to volunteer in the communities.

Young people aged 12-16 years are matched with local volunteer adult mentors and will receive 1 hour per week, one-one and face-to-face mentoring, for Term 1, 2019.

With the support of their mentors, participants connect with their communities by undertaking a community engagement activity of their choice, such as volunteering, fundraising, or creative project.

WHAT IS THE TARGET GROUP? The program is for young people aged 12-16 years old who would most benefit from a mentoring relationship. This could include young people who:

- Are under-engaged in school and/or local community life
- Have had limited opportunities to participate actively in school and/or local community
- Are interested in building a mentoring relationship
- Are enthusiastic about becoming more involved in their communities
- Are likely to benefit from a program that strengthens personal, interpersonal and community based protective factors.

WHO CAN BE A MENTOR? Anyone over the age of 21 can become a Youth Frontier mentor. Mentors don't need any special skills or experience, just enthusiasm and a desire to help young people reach their potential.

All mentors will need to be cleared through the relevant probity checks and will receive mentor training and support.

If you are interested in becoming a Mentor for a DCS student in 2019, please come to an information session from 9.30am to 12 noon on Thursday, 13th December in the Library Annex.
