Looking for some new tactics to support

your child with their maths?

Think of your job like a sports coach - you don't need to be the best player to become a really good coach. You can be a great coach for your child by listening carefully to your child's thinking, asking questions (instead of telling) and encouraging them.

You might say things like:

- Can you share your thinking with me?"
- ◊ "I like how you're thinking about..."
- I wonder if there are any patterns here... I wonder if they might be able to help us?"
- O "Do you notice anything interesting about..."
- What if we try working backwards?"
- I wonder if we could think about this another way?"
- ♦ "I like how you came back to that idea and thought about it differently"
- "Let's take a break for 5 minutes! Sometimes I need a brain break to give me some space to think."

What's happening in Mrs Piper's classroom?

Year 9/10 Science

Leading up to the examination period year 9/10 Science have studied the ecosystems that support life on our planet. We have looked at the impacts humans are having on our life support system and thought about solutions. One small solution was to install a 'pod' for recycling organic waste in the community vegie patch. We are just waiting for the worm eggs to hatch. They are really slow. Now, we are studying how we inherit characteristics through the DNA in our genes and how Science is using this knowledge to improve treatments for inherited diseases. This week we plan to extract some DNA from some strawberries.

10 History

We completed our study of 'The Holocaust' by setting up a display expressing our thoughts about this pretty horrible part of our History. As well as this Mr Lowen gave a presentation as he had some personal connection with this History. It was very much appreciated. We are now looking at Migration in Australia. We hope to hear stories from people in our community.

The Geography class have just received their first HSC assessment task 'Ecosystem at Risk' and will be researching and compiling information in class over the next week.

The Edge Deportment Day All Year 10 will participate in The Edge, Tuesday 24th November, as a wrap up of Year 10 and an introduction to the social world. Hosted by Sue, the day takes the format of group sessions where the gentlemen will cook and chat with Ben Kline, Liam Mayes and Mark Dent; the focus being changing work roles over time; while the ladies, with the assistance of Sue Baseggio and Penny Copelin, will experiment with acceptable personal presentation. Students take part in a luncheon, catered for by Mrs Scifleet, and attended by Year Adviser, Principal, Sue, Penny, Ben and myself. Following on from this, 2 guest speakers will address Year 10 about their journey through school, their experiences in the workforce and how circumstances change.
