What's happening in Mrs Milsom's classroom?

7/8 and 9/10 English

I would like to congratulate Stage 4 and Stage 5 English students for completing their Yearly Examinations. All exams have been marked and handed back to respective students. Some students performed exceptionally and received fantastic marks. If any parents would like to discuss any marks or have questions regarding the exam, please don't hesitate to contact the school. As the year draws to a close, students are finishing off their film and drama units. Students are currently watching and analysing their final films, before they commence a small introductory drama unit on Shakespeare and 3 of his plays; Hamlet, A Midsummer Night's Dream and Macbeth. This will involve students reading through abridged versions of the plays, selecting characters to act out and performing impromptu drama skits. This will be a fun and light way to introduce students to Shakespeare through drama, as many will study Shakespeare as they venture into Senior English.



9/10 Food Technology

Students have completed their final assessment based on Food Equity and were assessed on their practical, where they were marked on their ability to prepare and present food items without assistance and all marks have been distributed back to students. There will be only two more practical lessons this term as we will NOT be cooking during Week 10. Our remaining lessons will involve the cooking of festive food items to celebrate Christmas. Also please ensure to finalise payment for any outstanding practical lessons, and don't hesitate to contact the school if you have any queries regarding this matter.



3/4 Maths

All Stage 2 students have completed their Term 4 Diagnostic Test, with some fantastic results and evidence of growth and improvement amongst students. During class students have also been revising mathematical concepts they have learnt this year to consolidate their learning. Over the next few weeks students will be given the opportunity to participate in some fun hands on learning based on Length, Area and Three-Dimensional Shapes.

3/4 Science

During Science students have been investigating different types of packing and their properties. Students have recently conducted an experiment, where in groups they had to design and construct the packaging for a biscuit to ensure it could withstand being dropped without breaking. Many students were successful, and we will progress into designing other forms of packaging to protect various items as the term comes to an end.

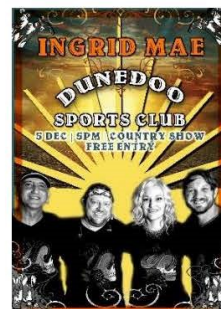

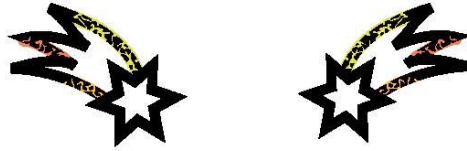
