

When there is a tornado the ozobots are given a tornado code to make them spin!

We are also enjoying reading Our Nim at Sea book. The students are chosen at random to read aloud to the class and everyone has been doing such a great job!

In Science this week we have to create a game for children using magnets. We have looked at examples such as the fishing game and this week the imagination and creativity will begin.


