Year 8 students have started a new unit in Term 4 where they learn about sexual health. They look at things such as growth and development of the body for both genders and how people transition through different stages of life, such as puberty differences. In practical lessons, they have been participating in some ball striking and net sports such as volleyball.

Year 9 and 10 PASS students have been studying a unit throughout Term 4 on 'Sport for Specific Groups' where they learn about how sport is modified and what popular sports are for different population groups such as the elderly, young people and people with a disability. During practical lessons, the students have been able to play some sports that are popular within some specific groups such as golf and lawn bowls.

10 PDHPE

Throughout Term 4, year 10 PDHPE students have been studying a topic called 'Your Own Self' where they learn about things such as what a sense of self is and what creates their own personal identity. They also look at how to show someone empathy and compassion and how different culture groups have different traditional values that contribute to a sense of self. Year 10 has been participating in a lot of indoor activities for practical lessons such as indoor hockey, soccer and cricket.

Chicken Parmisiana With Oven Baked Wedses

MILSON

Ingredients

Chicken Parmigiana

1 chicken breast

1C grated cheese

1 can diced tomatoes

1Tbsp Italian mixed herbs

1tsp crushed garlic

Salt & Pepper

1C breadcrumbs

1C flour

2 eggs

4Tbsp olive oil

Oven Baked Wedges

2 large potatoes, washed but not peeled

Drizzle of olive oil

2 tsp of Cajun seasoning (or your choice)

Salt & pepper

Method

- 1. WEDGES:
- 2. Preheat oven to 200°C.
- 3. Cut potatoes into wedges.
- Place wedges in bowl with olive oil, seasoning and salt and pepper. Toss to coat.
- Spread wedges on a lined oven tray and bake for approximately 25 minutes or until golden brown.
- 6. PARMIGIANA:
- Cut chicken breast in half, cover with gladwrap and flatten out using a rolling pin.
- 8. Add breadcrumbs, salt and pepper in a bowl.
- 9. Place flour in separate bowl.
- 10. Whisk eggs into another bowl.
- Working with one chicken piece at a time, toss in flour, dip in egg mixture, then press in breadcrumb mix to coat. Transfer to a plate.



- 12. Heat oil in a large frying pan over mediumhigh heat. Cook chicken for 4-5 minutes on each side or until golden. Transfer to a plate.
- Add diced tomatoes, herbs and garlic to fry pan. Cook, stirring for 5 minutes or until slightly thickened.
- 14. Preheat grill on medium-high heat. Place chicken on tray, spoon over tomato mixture, top with cheese. Grill for 4-5 minutes or until cheese if melted and golden.
