MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Welcome to Week 9 Term 4,



Year 12 - Today our Year 12 Cohort completed their final HSC Exam, Geography. We look forward to farewelling the Year 12's with a Graduation Assembly next Friday 10th December at Dunedoo Central School Hall at 10am. Parents and guests are invited to attend *providing they check in with the school's QR code and have proof of Double Vaccination.* The Formal Dinner will be held on Saturday 11th December at Jubilee Hall, Dunedoo. This is a celebration of 13 years of formal schooling for our students and we look forward to sharing this time with the students and their families.

Year 6—This Friday our Year 6 cohort celebrate the end of their Primary Schooling with an assembly followed by the 'Big Day Out' trip to Dubbo. Parents and guests are invited to attend the Assembly *providing they check in with the school's QR code and have proof of Double Vaccination.*

One day away per week means attendance is 80 %, which is unacceptable. The Department of Education has set school attendance targets to increase every students attendance to greater than 90%. Year 12 Ancient History & Standard English: Congratulations on completing your HSC examinations!


11 Advanced English: Welcome to HSC and our first unit of work; Texts and Human Experiences. Students have explored George Orwell's **1984** and the representations of human experience.



11 Ancient History: Have also begun their HSC journey, delving into the life of Agrippina the Younger in their *Personalities and their Time* topic. So far, we have investigated her history, family, and the significance that these had on her career and her overall impact on her time period.

9/10 English: Students are putting their acting hats on and entering the world of Shakespeare with *Macbeth*. 




10 Work Education

In the kitchen with MRS FERGUSSON

Cheesy Pumpkin Pockets

Ingredients 500g pumpkin 1tsp crushed garlic 1/2tsp sweet paprika 1/4 capsicum 2 spring onions 1/2 carrot 200g cheddar cheese 2Tbsp parmesan cheese 2 sheets frozen shortcrust pastry Milk for glazing Poppy seeds for garnishing Method

- 1. Preheat oven to 220°C.
- 2. Peel and chop pumpkin into 1.5cm cubes.
- 3. Place on lined baking tray, lightly spray with oil and bake for 10 minutes.
- Wash and finely chop capsicum, place in large bowl.
- Cut ends off spring onion, chop finely, add to capsicum.
- 6. Grate carrot and add to mix.
- Add paprika, cheeses, cooked pumpkin and garlic to mix. Combine gently.
- 8. Cut pastry in half forming 2 triangles.
- In the centre of each triangle, dollop some of the mixture. Lightly brush edges with milk, then fold in half to form triangle.
- 10. Press edges together with a fork to seal and enclose filling.
- Brush top with milk, sprinkle with poppy seeds and bake for 15 minutes or until golden.
- 12. Serve warm.
