*Secondary Excursion*—tomorrow our Year 7—10 students will be traveling to Newcastle to the Tree Tops Adventure Park at Minmi, followed by lunch at Newcastle Beach. # WHAT'S NEW WITH MRS TYLER

Year 7 Japanese classes are winding up on a food high. We are looking at Japanese food as an artform, learning how to eat with 'hashi' (chopsticks) and learning some table manners and vocabulary for eating in the company of Japanese people. As our final triumph, we are researching recipes for dishes that could be made by students in their own kitchens. These will be compiled into a recipe book. The photos below are of some of our students wearing hachimaki (headbands) that they made during our unit on 'Sport'.

# PiZZa Christmas Tree

## Ingredients

2 Puff Pastry Sheets, thawed 3-4 Tbsp Tomato Puree &/or pesto Salt to taste Olive Oil 1 C shredded mozzarella Egg, beaten Method

- Mix together the tomato puree, oregano, a drizzle of olive oil and salt to taste. Keep aside.
- Cut out two Christmas Tree shapes from the puff pastry sheets.
- Spread some of the prepared pizza sauce on one of the puff pastry Christmas Trees. Top with shredded mozzarella and cover with the other tree.
- Cut out the branches with a sharp knife, and press the sides to close well. Twist the branches and add a star at the top.
- Brush with beaten egg and bake at 180°C for 20 minutes, or until golden brown.
- 6. Serve warm, or at room temperature.
