

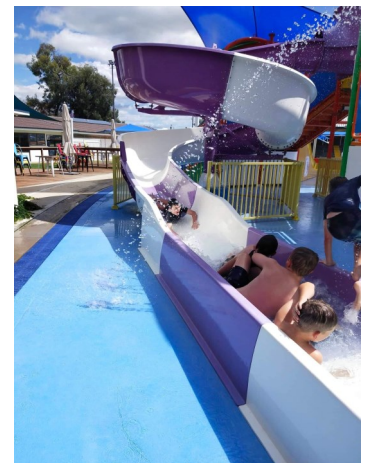


## SECONDARY EXCURSION - TREETOPS ADVENTURE PARK
