#### WHAT'S NEW IN INFANTS/PRIMARY—MEET OUR STUDENT TEACHERS

I am extremely excited to be working here at Dunedoo Central School. A bit about me; I am originally from Coolah, where I went to Primary School and played Junior Football. I then went to boarding school at Farrer. My interests include playing rugby union, rugby league and touch football.

I am currently in my third year of my Bachelors Degree in Primary Education and have found a love and passion for teaching. I live on the Central Coast, and am loving my experience in Dunedoo. #### WHAT' NEW IN SECONDARY & LIBRARY WITH MS TYLER

YEAR 7 MUSIC AND JAPANESE: This term, Year 7 have been completing assessment tasks started at the end of Term 3. In Japanese, the task was to create a Powerpoint slide show introducing an alien in Japanese and then showcasing a location in Japan that the alien could visit. This involved, as well as knowing the Japanese phrases, learning to type hiragana on a computer using an online hiragana program. Several students produced exceptional slide shows which were also very visually appealing and well-researched. From now, we will move into our unit entitled *Dining in Japan*. The students will study etiquette and food-related language and will create a class book of Japanese recipes.

In Music, the assessment task was to design, create and perform on an instrument using readily available materials, and to reflect on the process of creating. Some students were meticulous in the task. This term, we move on to *Music in the Movies* and every second Friday, there is the chance to do something which was not possible with pandemic restrictions: the students have a taster opportunity for learning an instrument or developing their singing. They appear to be enjoying these 'free' afternoons immensely.

*INFANTS AND PRIMARY LIBRARY*: The infants classes are listening to the 'underpants' series of picture books by Claire Freedman. We created a whole row of dinosaurs in technicolour undies to hang in the library. This week we are going to write about and make aliens in underpants. The primary classes are looking at different themes in *Behind the News*. So far, we have learned a lot about Queen Elizabeth II and some geographical facts by scrutinising the floods in Eastern Australia.





#### WHAT'S NEW IN SECONDARY WITH MRS HOGDEN

7– 10 exams begin next week. All junior classes should be practising questions in preparation for their final assessment for 2022! Practicing is the key to success in Mathematics!

**7 Maths:** have been making great progress with their introductory Algebra unit. Their final assessment will consist of concepts including generalising number properties to operate with and simplify algebraic expressions. Expanding expressions involving grouping symbols and substituting values into algebraic expressions. Time concepts will make up a small component of their exam, converting between common units of time and calculating time difference in both 12 and 24 hour representations.

- **8 Maths:** final assessment will include calculating measures of central tendency and location of data sets, along with ensuring they can construct and interpret graphs including histograms and stem and leaf plots. Simplifying rates and ratios and using these skills in practical based questions will make up the remaining part of their final examination.
- **5.2 Maths**: classes focus this term has been on Financial Mathematics. Their assessment will include wage and salary calculations, including overtime and holiday pay. Simple and compound interest will also be assessed and include loans and repayment considerations.
- **11 Numeracy:** have begun their HSC course and are sharpening their skills working with applications of percentages. They are recognising the importance of estimating answers to ensure calculated results are reasonable, whilst determining discounts, profits and calculating GST. This week we are focusing on using mental techniques to find percentages of quantities.

### School Travel

#### Term 4 2022

#### 2023 school travel applications are now open

Applications for student travel in 2023 open from Monday 10 October 2022.

Students who need a School Opal card or travel pass for 2023 can <u>apply</u> now. A new application will need to be submitted if they are applying for the first time, or if they are requesting an additional travel entitlement as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who change address, school, campus location, have repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should <u>renew or update</u> their details before **the end of term 4**. This will ensure that schools can endorse applications, and entitlements remain valid for the start of the 2023 school year. School Opal card holders will have the changes applied to their existing card.

If a student's distance eligibility has changed based on their grade (i.e. grade two to grade three), the system will automatically update their entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new eligibility criteria, we will send an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition that is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

Students in the Opal network applying for an Opal card (including a Term Bus Pass) for the first time will receive their Student Opal card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2023.

Students living in rural and regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the start of the new school year from their nominated transport operator. It may come via the school or be sent directly to them at home. **Note**: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

#### Travel from Term 12023

We ask that parents plan ahead and make sure their child knows which service/s to use and has a valid ticket to travel; either a School Opal card or Child/Youth Opal card (within Greater Sydney) or a School Travel Pass (outside Greater Sydney), from the start of the school year.

Applications for 2023 School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) travel open at the start of Term 4 2022, so parents/students can <u>apply</u> or <u>update</u> details early and be ready for the start of the new school year.

Most students using the Opal network will not need a new Opal card and can continue travelling on their existing card each year.

The start of the year is a busy period for local transport operators, and students travelling without a valid ticket make service planning and operations difficult.

We recognise that for some families last minute changes to school enrolments mean they may not have a School Opal card or Travel Pass for the start of term. In the Opal network, we strongly encourage these families to have their children travel with a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their <u>local</u> bus operator to discuss their travel needs.

Bus operators are flexible and understanding, particularly at the start of the school year, and will ensure students can travel safely to and from school. But to best support our operators we encourage all students to have a valid ticket, as early as possible, from the start of the school year.

Students using School Opal cards are also reminded that they must tap on and tap off in line with the <u>Student code of conduct</u> and <u>Opal terms of use</u>.

#### Intention to apply for Year 7 placement in a selective high school in 2024

Dear Parent/Carer

Selective high schools cater for academically gifted students with high potential who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic standard. Selective high schools help these students to learn by grouping them with students of similar ability, and by using specialised teaching methods.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2024, you need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address).

Detailed instructions on how to apply and the link to the online form will be available in early-October 2022 at <a href="https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-7">https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-7</a>.

Applications open on 18 October 2022 and close on 16 November 2022. You must apply before the closing date.

You must submit only ONE application for each student.

The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on Thursday 4 May 2023.

The tear-off slip below is NOT an application, it is advice to the school that you intend to apply. The school CANNOT apply on your behalf.
