Welcome to Week 5 Term 4,

Exams - Year 7—10 Exams are being completed this week. In most cases, this is the final formal assessment for 2022. Staff will then be working on reports to be distributed at the end of week 9. For Year 10 students *all outstanding assessment tasks must be submitted by the end of Week 5 so that grades can be submitted to NESA.*

Next week, K- 6 classes will complete their end of year assessments and Years 7—9 will complete their Check-in assessments for Reading.

Secondary Excursion - Years 7—11 students are reminded to return their notes for the Secondary Excursion to Wollongong ASAP.

Stand Tall— Last week our secondary students attended the Stand Tall Event in Dubbo. Both staff and students indicated that this was a very worthwhile experience and would definitely attend again. All staff and students who attended will be asked to complete a survey. This is an important part of providing valuable feedback and will hep support the organisers in being able to hold this very successful event in our regional areas on a regular basis.

Merit Assembly—congratulations to all students who received awards at the Merit Assembly yesterday. Again , students were recognised for excellent attendance. Students who attend school the maximum amount have time have the greatest potential for success. Parents are reminded that:

- When your child misses just **1** day per fortnight (90% attendance), this is equal to 4 weeks per year and **1** year over their school life.
- When your child misses *1 day per week* (80 % attendance), this is equal to 8 weeks per year and over *2.5 years over* their school life.
- Please discuss attendance with your child (contact the school if you would like to know your child's current rate of attendance)!

Kindergarten Orientation—We look forward to our Earlybird students starting this Thursday from 9:00 am—1:30pm. Tomorrow evening at 5:30pm, we have our Kindergarten parent information session and BBQ.

WHAT' NEW IN SECONDARY WITH MR O'BRIEN

Year ¾ HSIE are currently in the process of presenting their research task on various countries around the world. Year 5/6 HSIE have been looking at various biomes that make up our planet.

Year 7 History have sat their yearly examination this week. The students also submitted a research task on China selecting from the following three areas: The Great Wall of China, Emperor Qin Shihuangdi and the custom of 'Lily foot'.

Year 8 Geography completed their yearly examination on Monday, covering topics of 'Water in the world' and 'Interconnections'.

Year 9 Geography sat their yearly exam this week. The examination covered the concepts of urbanisation and the consequences and impacts that it has had; 'Internal migration' and the seven principles for cities of the future.

Year 9 History will complete their yearly examination this week which examines the roles played by different parties in World War 1 and World War 2.

Year 10 Geography completed their yearly examination on Monday. The examination included skills questions, stimulus question and the Human Development index, homelessness and an open ended question 'Is Australia a fair and equal society?'

WHAT'S NEW IN SECONDARY WITH MR LANE

7/8 Tas Agriculture: Throughout TAS Agriculture, students have been learning about the Dairy, Pork and Sheep industries and examining how valuable they are to Australia's economy and the nutritional requirements of Australia's people. During practical lessons, the class has planted some vegies and germinated them in seed pots, then moved them into the big vegetable garden to grow further. They have also been caring for the schools new baby chickens and hens.

9/10 Agriculture: Have started a new unit this term on the topic of Aquaculture. The students have learnt about what aquaculture is and how the growing protein requirements of Australia's growing populations means there is an ongoing demand for more fish and crayfish farms to be built. During practical lessons they have been caring for the school's poultry and participating in horticulture activities.

9/10 PASS: The class have started a new topic this term on Enhancing performance where they have been learning about things such as code of conduct, different types of rules for sports and the different stages of skill acquisition. Earlier in the term they completed an assessment task where they conducted a tabloids session for years 3/4 where the PASS class ran the students through different types of activities in the school hall. All students should be proud of themselves and how well they displayed leadership to the younger students.




