WHAT'S NEW IN PRIMARY WITH MRS LOUWEN

Term 4 is disappearing very quickly. We have finished our novel study of Dragon Riders and watched the movie. It was almost a unanimous vote; the book was better than the movie. The book had much more detail and excitement, and a better storyline. We won't tell you what happened at the end just in case you decide to read the book for yourself.

Fantastic Forces is our unit of study for Science this term. WHAT'S NEW IN SECONDARY WITH MRS DOUGLASS

Year 7/8 Tas: This group of students are continuing to complete their table runners. Each student is working towards joining this patchwork Table runner before they add wadding and finally quilt the centre square and selected areas to complete this project. There are a few students who have completed this Table Runner and are now working on sewing an Apron for themselves.

Year 9/10 Textiles: these students have completed a Unit on Patchwork and Quilting and have now started working on a Free Choice Unit. This Unit has seen projects like a child's dress, a skort, a play mat and various toys, and an organising caddy and woven wall art being constructed. Each student will compile a folio of pictures and written work to complement their free choice item.

Year 11 into Year 12: these students are beginning their journey of planning a Major Textiles Project. Each student is working towards researching, selecting and experimenting with their ideas and finding techniques to best create these Major Projects. Students will test fabrics, equipment and decorations and try new ideas and techniques as a way of enhancing their initial thoughts.


"Women play an important role in community development and making rural NSW a great place to live," Mrs Taylor said.


