WHAT'S NEW IN PRIMARY WITH MRS GALLAGHER

We had so much fun working with our prac teacher, Miss Morris, over the past four weeks. In Science we used our senses to examine how things change, and our experiment involved observing chocolate before and then after placing it in the sun. This was the most delicious experiment, and all students enjoyed using their sense of taste in the final stages of the experiment.

We've had a great year of learning, and would like to thank our fabulous SLSO's for their support throughout the year. We couldn't do it without you!













WHAT'S NEW IN SECONDARY WITH MRS GALLAGHER

Year 11 Mathematics Standard 2 students are studying the first topic in the Year 12 course 'Networks'. This topic involves looking at examples of networks including bus and rail routes, electrical and plumbing systems and road systems and using graph theory to try to improve them: faster process times, shorter distances, lower costs.

Year 11 Mathematics Advanced are finishing a topic on Exponential and Logarithmic Functions. This topic involves using laws of logarithms to solve problems, the introduction of the number 'e' and differentiation of logarithmic and exponential equations to investigate rates. Practical applications include problems involving Newton's law of cooling, the Richter scale to measure earthquakes and the pH of a solution. The next topic is Trigonometric Functions.

Year 9 Mathematics students are finishing 'Probability' and will commence 'Data Analysis'. We will continues learning new content in Mathematics right until the end of the school year.

Coonabarabran OOSH is operating, Vacation Care these December/January School holidays Monday 19th December 2022 to Wednesday 25th January 2023. Children who are attending school and are in Kindergarten to year 6, can attend this exciting program. Main activities are planned each day with children & educators planning together other leisure-based activities. If your child is enrolled at school and starting Kindergarten in 2023, they can attend the January 2023 Program. Families are eligible to claim the Child Care Subsidy (CCS) for the service which could reduce fees to as little as \$20 per day. Families who have applied for their NSW Before & after School Care voucher can now redeem the \$500 Voucher with Coonabarabran After School & Vacation Care. Vouchers can be redeemed between now and 31 December 2022. The credit on the voucher can then be used until 30 June 2023.

Fruit and healthy food options will be available for morning tea, lunch and afternoon tea. Children will need to bring their own water bottle.
