# What's happening in Mrs Harby's classes

## Year 9/10 Maths

This term the 5.1 Maths class have been working on 'Percentages' and then moved onto 'Financial Mathematics'. Financial Mathematics includes learning several practical life skills which will be incredibly valuable as these students come of working age. These skills include being able to read a payslip, determine wages and salaries, deductions and learning about superannuation. The 5.1 class will have an in-class maths test to complete on Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> April based on topics covered this term.

## 7 Maths

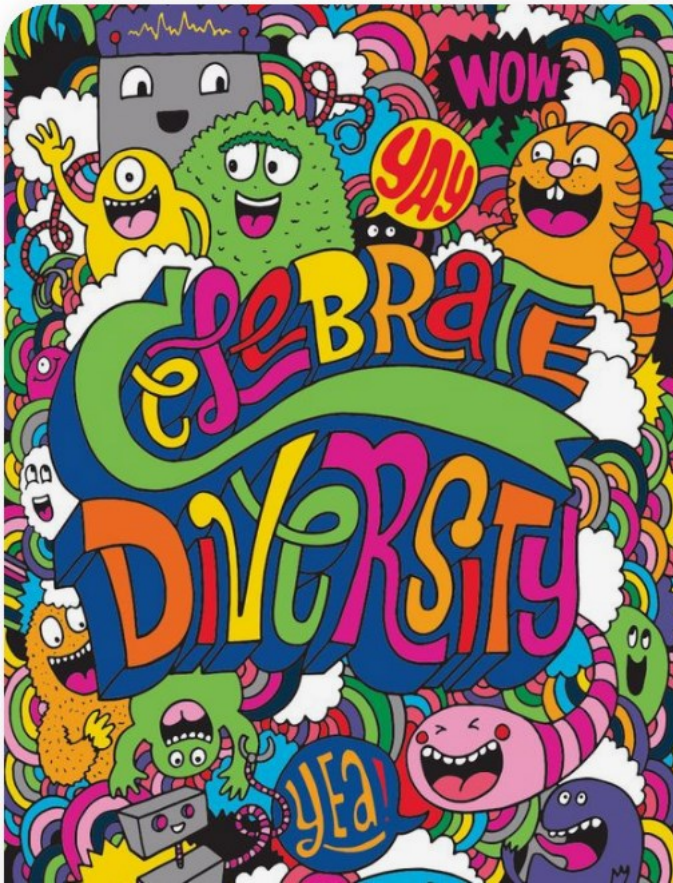
Year 7 have had a great start to Mathematics. We started the term learning about 'Integers' or whole numbers, and then moved onto Angle Relationships. Angle Relationships has been a challenging topic as it is very dense in vocabulary. The students will sit an in-class test for both units on Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> April.

## 7 Music

This term our unit has been on 'Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Music'. Students have been learning about traditional indigenous music features and how contemporary artists are incorporating aspects of traditional music into their works. We have also broken into groups and students have composed a percussion score to accompany a traditional Dreamtime story. This week students will be finalising their assessment task which involves researching their own culture and history and writing a speech for a podcast.

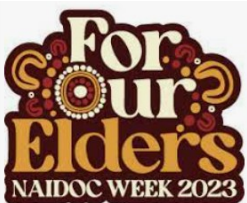

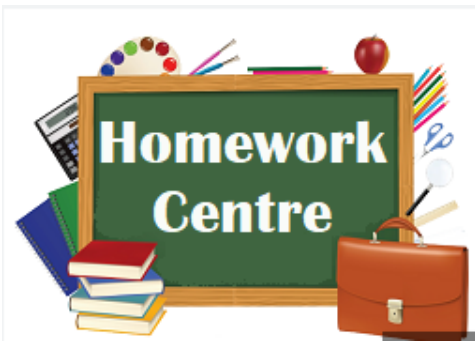

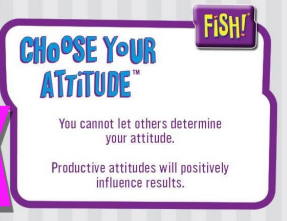

# Youth Navigators Club

Hi,

I am Pastor Barry Best and have been given permission and the school's blessing to start a Youth Navigators Club in the DCS School Hall every second Friday, starting on May 5th 2023.

It begins straight after school at 3.20pm and goes for approximately 1 hour (until 4.30pm pickup).

The aim of Navigators is to provide life skills for future development. The program would be first a snack and drink followed by a team building game, then earning badges in Life Skills.
